



At the June meeting for the State Board of Education, 2022 Georgia Teacher of the Year Cherie Bonder Goldman presented the report titled "Teacher Burnout in Georgia: Voices from the Classroom." The report details a dire situation in our classrooms: 31% of teachers are

ELEVATING TEACHER VOICE IN THE CLASSROOM CONVERSATIONS PODCAST



Getting Ready for 1st Grade

Want to prepare for the next school year?

Keep the learning going over the summer. Below are suggestions of skills families might explore together during the school break.



With parent/caregiver support...

- Begins to correctly judge basic emotions in others and the cause of emotions (she's mad because someone took her book)
- Uses positive self-talk to help regulate emotions
- Plavs well with others

Suppo

- · Waits patiently for a turn
- Sticks with a task even if it is hard or takes a long time
- Has skills to move through space with confidence; is working on throwing, catching, dribbling with hands and feet, volleying, striking, jumping rope
- Uses movements in games and activities; changes speed, height, direction, and type of movement (skips, slides, etc.)
- Participates in safe and vigorous physical activity daily and understands that moving quickly increases heart rate and breathing
- Follows directions alone and in a group; respects self and others during physical activity

English Language Arts

With parent/caregiver support...

- Reads common words (the, of, to) by sight and understands easy texts
- Practices phonics (letter sounds, letter blends like st, parts of words, words)
- Describes how pictures and text work together in books
- Uses different resources (books, magazines, the Internet) to get information and write about a topic
- Talks about new words and meanings; plays with words – words that mean the same thing; words that mean the opposite
- Uses words and phrases learned through conversations and books (read alone and read-to); responds to texts (read alone and read-to)
- Asks and answers questions about details texts (books, magazines, online)
- Speaks clearly; talks about thoughts and feelings
- Understands how print works; knows upper



DATE RANGE: 1/1/2022 - 9/23/2022






Core Functions: Develop and Manage Standards and Collaboration with Assessment on Test Questions Standards vs. Curriculum

- Standards are the learning goals for what students should know and be able to do at each grade level
 - -Student expectations
 - -Define success
 - -Remain constant
- A curriculum is the detailed plan used to teach students
 - -Includes activities, lessons, units, assessments, & instructional decisions
 - -Can be altered year-to-year or classroom-to-classroom








Standards Adoption Process

Local Control

The doctrine of "local control," which provides local school boards with the management and control of public schools, is deeply rooted in our state constitution. For this reason, the Georgia Department of Education has very limited authority over the daily operations of school systems. The concerns presented in your email, fall within the local management and control of a school district. Accordingly, the concerns presented in your correspondence are under the jurisdiction of the local school district and therefore must be resolved at that level.
