The project has been renewed for 2016-2017 school year.  Program goals are to provide early detection of mental health needs, access to services, and coordination between providers and school districts. There are 29 providers throughout the state.  Supports a "multi-tiered intervention model".  Referrals come through school social workers, counselors, local interagency planning teams, or student intervention teams.  Data shows that when mental health supports are in place, school attendance, academic performance engagement, and access to services are increased.  Other related projects include: Project AWARE, Project LAUNCH (early intervention program for ages 2-8), PBIS, and Mental Health First Aid.  Discussion Questions  Is there a best practice model?
