On November 9, 2011, at 8:30 a.m., the Budget Committee, Charter Committee, and Rules/Policy Committee met to consider State Board items to be presented to the Committee of the Whole.

On November 9, 2011, pursuant to the public hearing notice and posting of the agenda, Ms. Barrs called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. The Chair asked if there were any comments the public would like to make regarding the following rule:

Rule 160-4-9-.04 Charter Definitions

There were no speakers. At 1:10 p.m., by motion of Dr. Murray, seconded by Dr. Ragsdale, a unanimous affirmative vote was given to go into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing waivers, appeals, legal and personnel matters.

At 2:35 p.m., by motion of Dr. Murray, seconded by Ms. Zechmann, a unanimous affirmative vote was given to come out of Executive Session.

With recommendations from the Committee of the Whole, Thursday's action agenda was created. The Chair with consent from the Board members and the Superintendent moved to the Superintendent's Report.

Atlanta Public Schools Board of Education Hearing. The State Board reconvened the earlier Atlanta Public Schools Board of Education Hearing. The purpose of the hearing was to take action on the July 26, 2011, recommendation to the Governor as to removal of the Atlanta School Board Members as a result of accreditation issues. The final report from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools moved the district's accreditation from Probationary status to Accreditation with Advisement status. The State Board voted unanimously to recommend to the Governor not to remove the Atlanta Public School Board Members from office.

Network Plan for Regional Educational Service Agency (RESA) Board Members Fall, 2012

beginning in FY12, Regional Educational Service Agencies (RESAs) have developed this training plan to be implemented with newly appointed members of RESA boards of control. Boards of control are comprised of superintendents of member school systems, In response to SBOE Rule 160-5-1-.36 and Senate Bill 84 which require that local boards of education develop training plans presidents of area post-secondary institutions, and regional library representatives. RESA directors and board of control chairpersons will partner to provide three hours of training for newly appointed members of local boards of control. The training will focus on member roles and responsibilities as defined in law and rule, services and programs, and finance. Listed below are the standards and topics addressed in the training.

Domain Description: The board of education and superintendent form the governance leadership team of the local school system, and act in a manner that focuses on improving student achievement and organizational effectiveness.

Standard A

The governance leadership team is comprised of the local board of education and the superintendent, and adheres to appropriate roles and responsibilities, as defined in the state constitution, state law, local act and board policy.

Domain V: Board Meetings

Domain Description: In order to conduct official business for the purpose of improving student achievement and organizational effectiveness, the governance leadership team plans and conducts board meetings in accordance with Open Meetings Law and local board policy.

Standard A

The board announces and holds meetings in accordance with local board policy and the Open Meetings Law (O.C.G.A. §50-14-1).

Review Board of Control assurances which are adopted annually and submitted to GADOE (see attachment). Assurances cite critical elements of State Board of Education Rule 160-5-1-.13, Regional Educational Service Agencies.

Activities

Share board of control meeting critical features:
